A few words on the readings.

Genesis 9:8-17. This passage follows on the story of the Ark and the flood. God makes a promise that he will never again punish the earth for the sins of the people. He also gives a sign, that of the rainbow, an eternal symbol of the covenant that he makes with his people and the whole of his creation.

Peter 3:18-end. 1 Peter stresses that Christ died for our sins. He refers to the story of Noah and makes the connection between the way God saved Noah and his family from the flood and how he has saved and continues to save those who believe in him. Baptism is a sign of his saving work.

Mark 1:9-15. Mark's account of the beginning of Jesus' ministry is fast moving and sums up here three key events which mark it. The first is his **baptism by John** in the Jordan at which the Holy Spirit descends upon him. The second is his **time in the desert** where the Holy Spirit sends him and where he passes 40 days strengthening himself against his adversary, the devil. Following straight on **he begins to preach** about the Kingdom. His message is urgent and it is just as urgent for us now. 'The kingdom of God has come near; **repent and believe in the good news.'**
