A Few Words on the Readings

Ezekiel 34.11-16,20-24 The prophet Ezekiel evokes the wonderful promise made by God to care for his people. A promise that he so wonderfully renews, time and time again. **God is the shepherd of his people** but they, his sheep, belong to him and he will ensure they are cared for.

Ephesians 1. 15-23 Paul speaks of God's power at work in his creation and in the Resurrection of Jesus. God has placed Jesus at his right hand in heaven and has given him authority over all things and made him the **Head of the Church,** his body on earth. As members of his body we receive his life-giving power in our own lives.

Matthew 25. 31-end Just before his passion Jesus speaks of the Last Judgement. He refers to himself both as **the shepherd** who will separate his sheep from the goats and as the Son of Man who will be seated on a **royal throne**. Jesus the King and the Shepherd, just as Ezekiel had said. Jesus goes on to show what is expected of those who will enter into his Kingdom – they are to care for the poor and disadvantaged. **Truly I tell you, just as you did it to the least of these, you did it to me.** We pray that we might continue to serve him in others.
