Yet in every chapter Jesus's deity is revealed. John gives us the great 'I am....' statements. John gives us a powerful look at Jesus Christ, the eternal Son of God.

So why not read what John has to say and commit yourself, as he did, to believe in and follow him. It's a great read!

Let us pray: We thank you for your servant John and for all he wrote about you. Help us to follow these words so that your power and love are revealed to us, and so encourage us to believe in you. Help us to understand your nature so that we may grow every day as your followers.
